# Safety precautions

Avoid using your mobile phone in areas where it may cause interference or present a hazard. Follow local laws and regulations.



Avoid using your phone while driving. Your safety should always be your top priority.



Follow any rules or regulations in hospitals and health care facilities. Power off your phone near any medical apparatus.



# **Inserting a Micro-SIM card**




A Your phone supports only micro-SIM cards. Other sizes may not work properly. Contact your service provider to replace or purchase a new card. Power off your phone before installing or removing the micro-SIM card.





The dimensions (L x W) of a standard micro-SIM card is 15 mm x 12 mm (0.59 in. x 0.47 in.). Insert the micro-SIM card as shown in the following figure.



# Inserting a microSD card

Your Mate supports Class 10 microSD cards. You can expand your phone's storage capacity with a microSD card. Follow the operations in the figure below to install a microSD card.



When installing a microSD card, insert the card fully into the slot until it clicks into place. To remove a microSD card:

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Storage**.
- 3 Touch Unmount SD card
- 4. Push the microSD card against the slot to make it pop out, and then remove it.

# Charging the battery



Your phone's built-in battery is not user-removable. To replace the battery, contact an authorized service center. Do not attempt to remove it yourself.



↑ Your phone supports fast charging, which requires the provided power adapter and USB cable. Using other power adapters or USB cables may cause repeated restarts, extended charging time, excessive heat, device damage, or in extreme cases, an explosion.

Use the provided USB cable and power adapter to connect your phone to a power outlet. or use the USB cable to connect your phone to a computer.



#### **Battery indicator**

The battery indicator shows your phone's battery level.

- Blinking red: The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is higher than 10%.
- Steady green (when charging): The battery is almost or already full.

#### Important information about the battery

• If the battery power is depleted, you may not be able to power on your phone immediately after you begin charging the battery. This is normal. Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes before attempting to power on your phone.

- Rechargeable batteries have a limited number of charge cycles and may eventually need to be replaced. When the battery life becomes noticeably shorter, replace the battery.
- The time required to fully charge the battery depends on the ambient temperature and the age of the battery.
- If your phone is very low on power, it plays an alert tone and displays a
  message. If the battery level is extremely low, your phone automatically powers
  off.

# Powering your phone on and off

- To power on your phone, press and hold 😃 .
- To power off your phone, press and hold to display an option menu, and then touch **Power off**.
- If errors occur and you cannot power off your phone, press and hold for 10 or more seconds to restart your phone.

# Setting up your phone for the first time

When you use your phone for the first time, follow the onscreen instructions to set it up. When you power on your phone or open some applications for the first time, your phone walks you through basic operations. To read these instructions again, touch **Management** 

> from the home screen.

# **Getting started**

#### Gestures



**Touch**: Tap an item once. For example, touch to select an item or open an application.



**Touch and hold**: Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or more. For example, touch and hold an application, widget, or blank area to display the related option menu.



**Flick**: Where applicable, swipe your finger in the direction you want the screen to move. For example, you can flick left or right across the notification panel to dismiss a notification.



**Drag**: Touch and hold an item and then move it to another position. For example, you can re-arrange applications and widgets on the home screen this way.



**Pinch**: Pinch two fingers together to zoom out or stretch them apart to zoom in. For example, pinch together or apart to zoom in or out on a picture or web page.

# Locking and unlocking the screen

Locking the screen not only prevents your phone from carrying out undesirable operations when you are not using it, but also protects it from unauthorized use.

You can lock and unlock your screen in a number of ways. The pre-installed screen unlock method is used as an example in this section.

## Locking the screen

- Press 🖒 to lock the screen.
- After being idle for a specified period of time, your phone automatically locks its screen.
- To set the screen lock method, touch on the home screen. On the displayed General tab, touch Screen lock.

#### Unlocking the screen

- 1. If the screen is off, press 1 to wake it.
- 2. Drag odown to unlock the screen.



 $f{i}$  Drag  $f{\hat{o}}$  left or right towards an application to open it.

# Getting to know your home screen

Your home screens are where you'll find your favorite widgets and all your applications. We did away with the application list to give you a more convenient and direct path to your applications. The default home screen is shown below.



- Status bar: displays notifications and icons. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2 Display area: displays application icons, folders, and widgets.
- 3 Screen position indicator: shows the current screen's position.
- 4 Dock: displays your most common applications.
- 6 Navigation bar: displays virtual keys.

#### Switching between home screens

Running out of space on the home screen? Not to worry. Your phone lets you create more home screens for various application icons and widgets.

• Flick left and right across the screen to switch between the home screens.



• Pinch two fingers together to display the home screen thumbnails. Touch a thumbnail to enter that particular home screen.



# Taking a screenshot

Want to share an interesting scene in a movie or show off your new high score in a game? Take a screenshot and share away.

Press and the volume down button simultaneously to take a screenshot. Then, open the notification panel and touch  $\overset{\checkmark}{\checkmark}$  to share the screenshot. Screenshots are saved to the **Screenshots** album in **Gallery**.

#### Auto-rotate screen

Your phone features a tilt sensor. If you rotate your phone when browsing a web page or viewing a photo, the orientation of your screen will automatically change to landscape or

portrait view. You'll also be able to enjoy tilt sensor-based applications, such as some downloaded racing games.

To quickly turn the auto-rotate screen function on or off, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and touch.

If the auto-rotate screen function is turned on and your screen is in landscape view, you can flick left from the right of the screen to display the navigation bar.


# Hiding the navigation bar

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the All tab.
- 2. Under DEVICE, touch Navigation bar.
- 3. Touch Hide navigation bar.

After the function is turned on, you can touch  $\checkmark$  to hide the navigation bar. To display it again, flick up from the bottom of the screen.

# Using the notification panel

Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.



1

Touch to display the settings screen.

- 2 Touch to delete all notifications.
- Touch the switch shortcuts on the notification panel to turn functions on or off.
- Touch an application to start it and flick left or right across a notification to dismiss it.

# **Using one-hand operations**

Turn on one-hand operations to operate the large screen with ease using just one hand.

- 1. On the home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 2. Touch One-hand operations.
- 3. Select where you wish to apply one-hand operations.

With **One-hand operations** enabled, use the arrow on either side of the screen to move the screen lock, dialer, or other object to the left or right.

# Displaying suspend windows

Suspend windows let you operate multiple applications on the same screen.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Turn on Suspend button.
- 3. Touch to bring up the suspend windows screen. Here, you can open preset applications on your phone or move some of them around.
- i With **Suspend button** enabled, the suspend button will be displayed in most screens. To disable it, turn off **Suspend button**.

# Turning on gloves mode

Gloves mode lets you perform touchscreen operations even while wearing gloves.

- 1. On the home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 2. Touch the Gloves mode switch to enable gloves mode.

# **Accessing applications**

#### Starting applications and switching between them

On the home screen, touch an application icon to open it.

To switch to another application, touch to return to the home screen, and touch the icon of the application you wish to open.

#### Viewing recently used applications

To display the list of recently used applications, touch  $\Box$ . You can then:

- · Touch an application to start it.
- Flick left or right across an application to dismiss it.
- Touch to clear the list.

## Texting

Your phone comes with multiple text input methods. You can quickly enter text using the onscreen keyboard.

.....

- · Touch a text box to bring up the onscreen keyboard.
- To hide the onscreen keyboard, touch  $\checkmark$ .

#### Selecting an input method

- On the text input screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch to select an input method.
- To change your phone's default input method, touch on the home screen. Then touch the **All** tab. Under **PERSONAL**, touch **Language & input** > **Default** to select an input method.

#### Huawei input method

Slide your finger left or right across the onscreen keyboard to switch between the QWERTY and 9-key keyboards.




- Touch to switch between lowercase letters, uppercase letters, and caps lock.
- 2 Touch \*#12 to enter numbers and symbols.
- 3 Touch to enter emoticons.
- Touch to switch between QWERTY, 9-key, and other input modes.

## Android input method




- ullet Touch ullet to switch between lowercase and uppercase letters.
  - Quickly touch twice to turn on caps lock.




#### **Editing text**

Learn how to select, cut, copy, and paste text on your phone.



- Select text: Touch and hold the text to bring up . Then drag and to select more or less text, or touch Select all to select all text in a text box.
- · Cut text: Select text and touch Cut.
- · Copy text: Select text and touch Copy.
- Paste text: Touch where you want to insert the text, drag to move the insertion point, and touch Paste to paste the text you copied or cut.



# Configuring an input method

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under **PERSONAL**, touch **Language & input**.
- 3. Under **Keyboard & input methods**, touch the input method you wish to configure.

# Personalizing your phone

# Setting the theme

Your phone comes with a variety of themes. You can download more themes and mix and match theme elements to find a perfect fit.

#### Changing the theme

- 1. On the home screen, touch iii .
- 2. Select a theme and touch APPLY to apply it.

#### Customizing a theme

- 1. From the theme grid, touch **CUSTOMIZE CURRENT THEME**.
- 2. From the element list, choose the element you wish to modify.
- 3. When you are done, touch **SAVE AS MY THEME** on the **Customize** screen.

The customized theme is then saved to the **Local** tab.

# Changing the wallpaper

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Wallpapers.
- 3. From the Wallpapers screen, you can set the following items:
  - Lock screen wallpaper: Set the wallpaper displayed on the phone lock screen.
  - Home screen wallpaper: Set the home screen wallpaper.
  - Shake to change: Change the home screen wallpaper by shaking your phone.
  - Random change: The home screen wallpaper changes randomly.

# Setting the home screen transition effect

 On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.

- 2. Touch Transitions.
- 3. Select a home screen transition effect.

# Organizing home screen widgets and application icons

#### Adding a widget to the home screen

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Widgets.
- 3. Drag a widget from the screen's lower section to a screen thumbnail.
- If the home screen doesn't have enough space, your phone will automatically create a new home screen to the original's right and place the widget on the new home screen.

#### Deleting an application icon or widget

On the home screen, touch and hold the application icon or widget you wish to delete until

- is displayed. Drag the unwanted application icon or widget to to delete it.
- Deleting an application icon uninstalls the application. When you delete an application icon, your phone prompts you to confirm the action. Touch OK to uninstall the application.

# Moving an application icon or widget

You can re-arrange application icons and widgets to any fitting empty space on the home screen.

# Organizing home screen icons using folders

# Creating a folder on the home screen

- 1. On the home screen, drag an item onto another one to create a folder containing both of them.
- 2. You can then:
  - · Touch the folder name to rename it.

• Touch + and add more items to the folder.

#### Removing an item from a folder

- 1. On the home screen, touch a folder.
- 2. Drag an item out from the folder to remove the item.

A folder must contain at least two items; otherwise, the folder will automatically disappear.

# **Customizing Me Widget**

**Me Widget** is a collage of popular widget units that is displayed on your home screen for your added convenience. They include contacts, music, clock, and weather.



# Removing a widget unit

- Touch and hold Me Widget until your phone vibrates. Release your finger. The
   icon is displayed in the upper right corner.
- 2. Touch to enter editing mode.
- 3. Touch X for the widget unit you wish to remove.
- 4. When you are done, touch  $\checkmark$ .

# Adding a widget unit

- 1. Touch and hold Me Widget until your phone vibrates. Release your finger. The icon is displayed in the upper right corner.
- 2. Touch to enter editing mode.

- 3. Flick left or right across the widget unit list, select a widget unit and drag it to a blank area on Me Widget.
- Me Widget's size cannot be adjusted, so space is limited. If there is not enough space for a new widget unit, delete some existing ones first.
- 4. When you are done, touch  $\checkmark$ .

#### Moving a widget unit

Before you move a widget unit, make sure there is enough space to hold it in the new position.

- 1. Touch and hold Me Widget until your phone vibrates. Release your finger. The icon is displayed in the upper right corner.
- 2. Touch 🖍 to enter editing mode.
- 3. Touch and hold a widget unit until your phone vibrates, and drag it to the new position.
- 4. When you are done, touch  $\checkmark$ .

# **Customizing your home screens**

#### Re-arranging home screens

- 1. On a home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home screen** dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- Touch and hold a home screen thumbnail until your phone vibrates, and drag it to the new location.

#### Adding a home screen

- 1. On a home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home screen** dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- 3. Touch + to add a home screen.

# Deleting a home screen

Only blank home screens can be deleted.

- 1. On a home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home screen** dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- 3. Touch X to delete a home screen.

# Customizing switch shortcuts on the notification panel

You can rearrange your switch shortcuts and move those you use most to top the list. Shortcuts on the top will be fully displayed on the notification panel.

- 1. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Flick left on the upper area. Touch to display the switch shortcut list.
- 3. Drag a switch shortcut to a new position in the list.

# **Managing profiles**

#### Changing the profile

- 1. On the home screen, touch .
- 2. From the profile list, select a profile and touch the button to its right to activate the profile.
- You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and change the profile using the switch shortcuts.

# Adding a profile

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛂 .
- 2. Touch +.
- 3. Touch the text box and name the profile.
- 4. Touch Next.
- 5. Select actions for the profile and touch an action to configure its settings.
- 6. When you are done, touch **Done**.

# Deleting a profile

To delete a custom profile, perform the following operations:

- 1. On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Touch > Delete.
- 3. Select the profiles you wish to delete.
- 4. Touch **DELETE**.
- 5. Touch OK.
- Preset profiles cannot be deleted.

#### **Setting tones**

#### Setting the ringtone

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- 3. Touch **Phone ringtone** and select either of the following options from the displayed dialog box:
  - · Ringtone: choose from the default selection.
  - Local music: choose from the audio files you have saved to your phone.
- 4 Touch OK

# Changing message tone and other tones

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- 3. Touch Notification tone.
- 4. Select a tone type.
- You can configure the email notification tone only after you have set up an email account.
- 5. Select a tone.
- 6. Touch **OK**.

# **Changing the font size**

1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.

- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Display**.
- 3. Touch Font size and select a font size.

# Setting the screen unlock method

#### Face unlock

Enable your data service before using face unlock for the first time.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Face Unlock.
- Follow the onscreen instructions to take a photo of your face.
   Your phone will use face unlock as the primary unlock method.
- 5. Set a secondary unlock method.

If face unlock cannot recognize you (dim light, for example), follow the onscreen instructions to unlock your phone using the secondary unlock method.

To turn off face unlock, use the secondary unlock method to enter the **Screen lock** screen, and select another unlock method.

# Unlocking the screen with a pattern

- 1. On the home screen, touch ( then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Pattern.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.
- If you draw incorrect patterns five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

# Unlocking the screen with a PIN

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > PIN.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock PIN.

After a screen unlock PIN is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

# Unlocking the screen with a password

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- Touch Screen lock > Password.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock password.
- 5. Repeat the password and touch **OK**.

After a password is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

If you enter incorrect passwords five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

# Adjusting the screen brightness

- 1. On the home screen, touch ( then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Display**.
- 3. Touch Brightness.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, perform either of the following operations:
  - Select the Automatic brightness check box to have your phone automatically
    adjust its screen brightness based on the ambient light.
  - Drag the slider left to reduce the screen brightness or drag it right to increase the screen brightness.

You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and adjust the screen brightness using the switch shortcuts.

# **Calls**

# **Smart dialing**

In addition to standard call procedures, smart dialing lets you quickly find contacts by entering parts of their names or numbers.

- 1. On the home screen, touch  $\bigcirc$  .
- Enter a phone number or the initials or first several letters of a contact name.
   Matching contacts in your phone and phone numbers in your call log are then displayed in a list.
- 3. From the list, select the contact you wish to call.

# Answering or rejecting a call

When a call comes in, you can press the volume button to mute the ringtone.



- Drag right to answer the call.
- Drag left to reject the call.
- Drag Oup to reject the call and send the caller a message.
- On the dialer screen, touch > Settings > Quick responses to edit the message that will be sent.

# Viewing the call log

- 1. On the home screen, touch **u** to display your recent calls above the dialer.

# Making a conference call

Conference calling with your friends, family, and co-workers is easy. Make or answer a call, and dial another number to add the second participant to your conference call.

- Before you make a conference call, make sure that you have subscribed to the conference call service. For details, contact your service provider.
- 1. Call the first participant.
- 2. When the call is connected, touch  $\Rightarrow$   $\mathcal{C}_{\Theta}$  to call the second participant. The first participant will be placed on hold.
- 3. When the second call is connected, touch  $\lambda$  to start a conference call.
- 4. To add more people to the call, repeat steps 2 and 3.
- 5. Touch to end the call.

# Answering a third-party call

Before you answer a third-party call, make sure that you have turned on call waiting.

# Making emergency calls

In the event of an emergency, you will still be able to make emergency calls without the use of a SIM card. However, you must still be under the coverage area.

#### Other call services

Your phone also supports other call functions, such as call forwarding, call waiting, and voicemail. Before you use these functions, make sure that you have subscribed to these services. For details, contact your service provider.

#### **Enabling call forwarding**

Too busy to answer all your calls with one phone? Forward them to another number and never miss an important call again!

Before you use voicemail, make sure you have subscribed to the voicemail service and obtained your voicemail number. For details, contact your service provider. You must also enable call forwarding and set all incoming calls to be forwarded to your voicemail.

You phone then searches for available Bluetooth devices.

- 1. On the home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch to enable your phone's data service.
- When you don't need to access the Internet, disable the data service to save battery power and reduce data usage.

# Setting up a Wi-Fi connection

When you use your phone at home, you can connect to the Wi-Fi hotspot created from your router. Some public locations, such as airports and libraries, may also have Wi-Fi networks available for use.

### Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Wi-Fi.
   Your phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays them.

- Choose the Wi-Fi network you wish to connect to and touch Connect.
   For an encrypted Wi-Fi network, enter the password when prompted.
- If Wi-Fi and mobile data are both enabled, your phone connects to the Wi-Fi network preferentially. When Wi-Fi becomes unavailable, your phone automatically switches to the mobile data connection.

#### Connecting to a Wi-Fi network using the WPS

The Wi-Fi protected setup (WPS) lets you quickly connect to a Wi-Fi network. A safe connection is set up by pressing the WPS button or entering the PIN, instead of complex settings on the management software of Wi-Fi hotspots, such as wireless routers.

To use the WPS function and set up a Wi-Fi connection between your phone and a Wi-Fi hotspot, make sure that the Wi-Fi hotspot also supports the WPS.

#### Using the WPS button

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. On the Wi-Fi network list, touch .
- 4. On the Wi-Fi hotspot device, press the WPS button.

#### Using the WPS PIN

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS. touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. On the Wi-Fi network list, touch . .
- 4. Touch Input WPS PIN.

Your phone generates a PIN.

5. On the Wi-Fi hotspot device, enter the PIN.

#### Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct lets you easily connect two devices and transmit or share data between them.

#### Connecting two devices using Wi-Fi Direct

1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.

- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. On the Wi-Fi network list, touch .
- 4 Touch Wi-Fi direct

You phone then scans for available devices and displays them.

5. Select a device.

#### Sending a file using a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Touch and hold the file you wish to send.
- 2. From the displayed option menu, choose Share.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi.
- 4. Touch Other devices.

You phone then scans for available devices and displays them.

- 5. Touch the device you wish to send the file to.
- The specific steps vary with the file type.

#### Receiving a file using a Wi-Fi network

When a file comes in, your phone displays the **File transfer** dialog box. To receive the file, touch **Accept**.

By default, received files are saved to the Wi-Fi folder in File Manager.

### Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

Want to access the Internet from multiple devices when you are on the go? Use USB tethering or set your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot to share its data connection with other devices.

#### **USB** tethering

You can share your phone's data connection with a computer using a USB cable.

To use USB tethering, you may need to install your phone's driver on the computer or establish a network connection, depending on your computer's operating system. If your computer runs Windows 7, Windows Vista, or a latest Linux operating system (such as Ubuntu 10.4), you can use your phone's USB tethering function without configuring any settings on the computer. If your computer runs an earlier version of Windows or another operating system, it will identify your phone and install its driver automatically.

1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.

- 2. On the home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 3. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 4. Touch Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 5. Select the **USB tethering** check box to share your phone's data connection.
  - You cannot use your phone's USB tethering function when the phone is in USB storage mode.

#### Bluetooth tethering

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with other devices using Bluetooth.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch **Tethering & portable hotspot**.
- 4. Select the **Bluetooth tethering** check box.
- 5. On the Bluetooth device you wish to use, search for and connect to your phone.

#### Wi-Fi hotspot

Your phone can also function as a Wi-Fi hotspot for other devices, sharing its mobile data connection.

- 1. On the home screen, touch ( then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- Touch Tethering & portable hotspot > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings >
   Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 4. Name the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5. Select an encryption mode.
- it is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2PSK to better secure the Wi-Fi network.
- 6. Set the key to the Wi-Fi hotspot.

When other devices want to access your phone's network, this key must be entered.

7. Select the **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** check box.


- On the device you want to use, search for and connect to your phone's Wi-Fi network.
- To manage the devices allowed to connect to your phone, touch Manage allowed devices and clear Allow all devices to connect. To add an allowed device, touch Add device.

### Controlling your data usage

Your phone's data usage control function lets you check and control your data usage.

Set a data usage cycle and a mobile data limit for this period and you will be notified when data usage reaches this limit. You can also query the data usage within a certain period of time or data traffic consumed by an application.

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.



- Turn the mobile data connection on or off. To configure data control and query data usage, the mobile data connection must be turned on.
- 2 Turn the mobile data usage limit on or off.

Set the data usage cycle.

Touch Data usage cycle then Change cycle... to set the data usage cycle.

Set the data usage limits. The yellow line indicates the warning limit, and the red line indicates the data usage limit.

Drag the red and yellow lines to adjust the values or touch the lines to set specific values.

When your data usage reaches the yellow line, you will receive a warning notification. When your data usage reaches the red line, your phone's mobile data connection will be disabled.

- Time axis.

  Drag the time axes to set a data usage cycle.
- 6 Display the data usage of each application.

On the **Data usage** screen, touch to open an option menu, from which you can:

- Turn data roaming on or off.
- Prevent background mobile data traffic.
- · Turn automatic data synchronization on or off.
- Select the **Show Wi-Fi usage** check box. The **Wi-Fi** tab will be displayed. Touch this tab to view Wi-Fi data usage.
- Touch Mobile hotspots and select the Wi-Fi networks that are mobile hotspots
  to prevent applications from accessing these networks in the background. If
  an application is downloading a large file using these networks, you will be
  notified.

# **Sharing data**

#### **Bluetooth**

Your phone is Bluetooth-capable, allowing you to connect to other Bluetooth-enabled devices for wireless data transmission. When using Bluetooth, stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of other Bluetooth devices.

### **Turning on Bluetooth**

- 1. On the home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.

When Bluetooth is turned on, your phone's name is displayed at the top of the **Bluetooth** screen. Touch the name to set your phone's visibility.

#### Searching for and pairing with other Bluetooth devices

To exchange data with another Bluetooth device, enable Bluetooth on both devices and pair them with each other.

- 1. On the home screen, touch ( then the All tab.
- Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.Your phone then scans for Bluetooth devices in range.
- 3. From the list of detected Bluetooth devices, touch a device and follow the onscreen instructions to pair with it.

To disconnect from a paired Bluetooth device, under **Paired devices**, touch  $\frac{-1}{2-1}$  > **Unpair**.

If a Bluetooth connection cannot be set up between your phone and another device, they may be incompatible, in which case you will need to pair with a different device.

### Transferring files using Bluetooth

Bluetooth enables you to conveniently send photos, videos, and other files to your family and friends. You can share files with Bluetooth-enabled devices without an Internet connection.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 

  .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to send.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Share** > **Bluetooth**.
- 4. From the detected Bluetooth device list, select a device.

#### Receiving files using Bluetooth

- 1. When your phone receives a file transfer request, open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch Bluetooth share: Incoming file to display a file reception dialog box.
- 3. Touch Accept to start receiving the file.

When the file is received, you will receive a notification of a successful transfer. Open the notification panel to read the notification. By default, received files are saved to the **bluetooth** folder in **File Manager**.

#### **DLNA**

The Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) aims to implement intercommunication between computers and other electronic products through wired and wireless networks, providing users with seamless digital media services. DLNA enables users on the same Wi-Fi network to share multimedia files easily. Using DLNA, you can:

- Share multimedia files with your friends.
- · Access multimedia files on other DLNA devices.
- Play multimedia files on other devices and control the playback.
- Before you use DLNA, make sure that your phone and other DLNA devices have connected to the same Wi-Fi network and DLNA is enabled on all devices.

On the home screen, touch **Tools** > to display the DLNA screen. You can then share photos, videos, and songs with other DLNA devices, as well as view and download the multimedia files shared by other DLNA devices.

# Connecting your phone to a computer

When you connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable, your phone will display a notification prompting you to select a connection type.

#### MTP mode

The Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) is used to transfer media files, such as pictures, songs, and videos, between your phone and a computer. Whether the MTP mode can be used depends on the version of Windows Media Player installed on the computer. Before you use this connection mode, make sure that Windows Media Player 10 or later has been installed.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the Media device (MTP) check box.
   The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. After the driver is installed, follow the onscreen instructions on the computer to view or transfer files.

#### PTP mode

The Picture Transfer Protocol (PTP) is another method to transfer pictures and videos to your computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the Camera (PTP) check box.The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. After the driver is installed, follow the onscreen instructions on the computer to view or transfer files.

#### HiSuite mode


HiSuite mode lets you back up and restore data in your phone, manage applications and application data, and synchronize data, such as contacts, messages, pictures, songs, videos, and calendar, between your phone and a computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the HiSuite check box.
   The phone driver and HiSuite are then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. From the displayed HiSuite window, perform your operations accordingly.

#### Mass storage mode


In mass storage mode, you can use your phone as a USB mass storage device and transfer files between your phone and a computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the USB mass storage check box.The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. Transfer files between your phone and the computer.



### Connecting your phone to a USB storage device

You can connect your phone to a USB storage device directly using the provided USB OTG cable to transfer data. Compatible USB storage devices include USB flash drives, card readers, and phones that work as USB mass storage devices.



To connect your phone to another phone, make sure that the phone you wish to connect to supports the USB mass storage function and has a microSD card installed. To establish the connection and read data stored on the microSD card:

- 1. Use a USB OTG cable and USB cable to connect the two phones.
- 2. Enable the USB mass storage function on the phone from which you wish to read data.
- 3. On your phone's home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 4. Touch Storage > Mount USB storage.
- 5. Read data from the microSD card of the other device.
- ⚠ Do not remove a storage device from your phone before unmounting; otherwise, data may become corrupted. Before removing the device, touch
  - on the home screen. Then touch **All** > **Storage** > **Unmount USB storage** to unmount the USB device.
- Your phone supplies power to USB storage devices. Certain phone models and mobile hard drives have relatively high rates of power consumption, meaning your phone may not be able to supply enough power for them to run properly.

# File Manager

**File Manager** helps you manage files and applications in your phone's internal storage and microSD card. You'll be able to view, create, edit, delete, move, archive, compress, and decompress files.

# Creating a folder

You can create folders to better manage the files and applications stored in your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

- 1. On the home screen, touch [11].
- 2. Touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch > New folder.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, name the new folder.
- 5. Touch Save.

### Searching for a file

Too many files stressing you out? The search function helps you find what you need in no time.

- 2. Touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch > Search.
- 4. Enter part or all of the file name.
- 5. Touch Q in the lower right corner of the keyboard.

### Copying or cutting a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛅 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to copy or cut.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Copy or Cut.

- 4. Select where you wish to paste the file.
- 5. Touch Paste.

### Compressing or decompressing files

You can compress files into .zip files to save space or decompress .zip and .rar files.

- 1. On the home screen, touch [11].
- 2. Touch and hold the file or folder you wish to compress.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Compress.
- 4. Choose the save path of the compressed file and name it.
- 5. Touch OK.

To decompress a file, touch and hold it and choose **Extract** from the displayed option menu.

### Renaming a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛅 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to rename.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Rename.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, enter a new name for the file.
- 5. When you are done, touch **OK**.

### **Deleting** a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🧮 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to delete.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Delete**.
- 4. Touch OK.

# Creating a shortcut for a file or folder

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🧮 .
- 2. Touch the file or folder you wish to create a shortcut for.

3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Desktop shortcuts**.

# Checking the memory status

Before you save large files to your phone's internal storage or microSD card, make sure there is enough space first.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛅 .
- 2. Touch > Storage.
- 3. On the **Storage settings** screen, view the total and available spaces of your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

# Managing applications

### **Downloading applications**

A rich selection of applications are available to download through an application store, such as Google's **Play Store**. You can also connect your phone to a computer and transfer applications over that way.

### Installing an application

- It is recommended that you use Play Store as your primary download source. Certain third-party applications from other sources may not be compatible with your phone.
- 1. On the home screen, touch **Management** > 1.
- 2. Select the application you wish to install.
- 3. Touch > Install.
- 4 Touch Done
- ① During the installation, a Install blocked message may be displayed. Read the message carefully. If you want to continue with the installation, touch then All > Security, and select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of third-party applications. Then touch to proceed.

### Viewing applications

You can view detailed information about all applications installed on your phone.

- 1. On the home screen, touch (iii) then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Select the application you wish to view.

### Uninstalling an application

You can remove unwanted applications to increase your phone's available storage.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3 Flick to ALL
- 4. Select the application you wish to uninstall.
- 5. Touch Uninstall > OK.
- Some pre-installed applications cannot be uninstalled.

### Clearing the application cache

You can clear the application cache to free up the phone memory.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Touch Clear cache.

# **Backup**

Backup lets you back up your important data and restore them after a system upgrade or reset

### Backing up data to local storage

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Management** > **Q** .

- 2. Touch Back up to SD card.
- 3. Select the data you wish to back up.
- 4. Touch Backup.
- 5. Enter a password when prompted.
- 6. Touch Backup.

By default, backup files are saved to the HuaweiBackup folder in File Manager.

### Restoring data from local storage

- 2. Touch Restore from SD card.
- 3. From the backup file list, choose the file you wish to restore.
- 4. Enter the backup password.
- 5. Touch OK.
- 6. Touch Restore.

# **Google services**

To use Google services, sign in with a Google account. If you don't have one, open a Google application and follow the onscreen instructions to create your Google account.

Google applications, services, and functions vary with country and service provider. Please follow local laws and regulations when you use Google services.

#### **Gmail**

**Gmail** is Google's official email service. When you first use **Gmail**, emails on your web account will be synchronized to your phone.

#### Sending emails

- On the home screen, touch Google Apps > 
   <sup>™</sup> to open your mailbox.
   If you have added more than one Gmail account, select the one you wish to use.
- 2. Touch
- 3. Enter the recipient and subject and compose your message.
- 4. Touch .

### Checking your emails

- On the home screen, touch Google Apps > to enter your mailbox.
   If you have more than one Gmail account, select the one you wish to use.
- 2. From the email list, select the email you wish to read.

  - Touch > Reply all to reply to all.

#### **Talk**

**Talk** is an instant chat application provided by Google. With **Talk**, you can reach friends using messages, or voice and video chats.

### Adding a friend

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > talk .
- 2. Touch 🚉 .
- 3. Enter the email address of your friend.
- 4. Touch 🗸 .

If the recipient accepts your invitation, he or she will appear in your friend list.

#### Starting a conversation

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > talk .
- 2. From your friend list, touch the one you wish to talk to.
- 3. Compose your message.
- 4. Touch

### Maps

**Maps** helps you find out where you are, shows you how to get to a destination, and displays real-time traffic. Satellite view is also available.

### Turning on location services

Before you use **Maps** to search for a location, turn on your location services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Touch Location access.
- 3. Select the Wi-Fi & mobile network location and GPS satellites check boxes.

### Searching for places of interest

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > **\textstyle{1}**.
- 2. Touch 🔍 .
- 3. Enter the location you wish to search for.

The search results are marked on the map by letters.

5. Touch a mark to see how to get there and view more details about the location.

#### Checking how to get to a place

- 1. When you browse a map, touch .
- 2. Touch the first text box to enter the start point. Then, touch the second text box to enter the destination
- 3. Select a transportation method: by car, public transportation, or foot.
- 4. Touch Go.

Available routes are then shown in a list.

- 5. Touch the route you prefer to display on the map.
- 6. To start a new search, touch > CLEAR MAP to clear the search results.

#### YouTube

**YouTube** is Google's online video-sharing website, where you can search for, watch, and upload videos.

### Searching for a video

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** >  $\frac{1}{100}$ .
- 2. Touch Q.
- 3. Enter the keywords.
- 4. Touch  $\bigcirc$  in the lower right corner of the keyboard.
- 5. From the search results, touch a video.

### Sharing a video

### **Play Store**

**Play Store** is an application market provided by Google, where you can download applications and games.

### Installing an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Find the desired application.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to download and install it.

### Uninstalling an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch 📔 .
- 2. Touch > **My Apps**.
- 3. From the application list, touch the application you wish to uninstall.
- 4. Touch **Uninstall > OK** to uninstall the application.

### **Basic utilities**

Your phone comes with a variety of useful tools, such as **Calendar**, **Clock**, and **Calculator**, helping you keep yourself organized.

#### Calendar

**Calendar** is your personal assistant that helps you manage, arrange, and keep track of all important events.

#### Creating an event

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch > New event.
- 3. Enter event details, such as the event name, time, and location.
- 4. Touch 🗸 .
- You can also touch any date on the calendar to create an event.

### Viewing events

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch the time in the upper left corner to switch between day, week, month, and agenda views.

The agenda view displays all your calendar events, which lets you know your schedule at a glance.

#### Sharing an event

You can share an event with your family and friends in a number ways, such as Bluetooth.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Open an event you wish to share.
- 3. Touch > Send event.
- 4. Select a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions.

#### Synchronizing and viewing events

Calendar events in your accounts (such as an email account) can be synchronized to and viewed on the **Calendar** application.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch > Calendars to display.
- 3. Select the account whose calendar you wish to display.
- 4. Touch > Calendars to sync.
- 5. Select the account from which you wish to synchronize calendar events.
- 6 Touch OK

### Modifying calendar settings

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch > Settings.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to configure the calendar settings.

#### Clock

**Clock** lets you view the time around the world, use stopwatch or timer to keep track of time, or set alarms to wake you up in the morning.

### Adding an alarm

- 1. On the home screen, touch .
- 2. From the alarm list, touch +.
- 3. Set the alarm time, ringtone, how often it repeats, and more.
- 4. Touch DONE.
- ${\it i}$  Enabled alarms will go off even when your phone is powered off.

#### Deleting an alarm

- 1. On the home screen, touch .
- 2. From the alarm list, touch and hold the alarm you wish to delete.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Delete alarm**.
- 4. Touch OK.

### Configuring alarm settings

- 1. On the home screen, touch .
- 2. From the alarm list, touch > Settings.
- 3. On the alarm settings screen, set the ringing mode, snooze duration, and more

#### Calculator

Calculator lets you make make simple or complex calculations.

- 2. On the Calculator screen, flick left or right to switch between the advanced and basic panels.

#### Notes

**Notes** is a handy application that lets you record guick thoughts or important information

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Touch Add note.
- 3. Enter what you wish to record.
- 4. When you are done, touch 📙 .
- On the **Notes** screen, you can touch and select one or more notes to delete them at a time, or select All to delete all notes.

#### Weather

Weather provides you with the latest weather information for any city around the world. You can share weather information with your family and friends.

Before you use **Weather**, turn on your phone's GPS and data service.

### Adding a city

You can add cities you like to Weather and check their weather information.

1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** >



- 2. Touch = > +.
- Apart from your current city, you can add up to nine cities.
- Enter a city name.Matching cities are then displayed.
- 4. Select the city you wish to add.

### Setting the default city

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Touch => 1.
- 3. Touch the city you wish to set as the default city.

#### Deleting a city

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Touch ==> 1 .
- 3. Select the city you wish to delete, and touch **DELETE**.

#### **Updating** weather

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you wish to update.
- 3. Touch  $\mathcal C$  to update the weather.
- You can also set **Weather** to automatic update mode. Touch , select **Auto update**, and set **Update interval**. Your phone will then update the weather at the interval you set.

### Sharing weather information

Your phone lets you send weather information as a text message to remind your family and friends of weather changes.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** >
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you wish to share.
- 3. Touch < to display the messaging screen.
- 4. You can then:

- Enter a phone number.
- Touch  $\blacksquare$  to select a contact.
- 5. Touch to send the weather information to the recipient.

#### FM radio

Want to listen to your favorite broadcast programs? Open **FM Radio** anytime anywhere you like.

Onnect a headset to the phone. FM Radio utilizes the headset as an antenna.

#### Listening to FM radio

On the FM radio screen, you can perform the following operations:



- 1 Touch U to turn the FM radio on or off.
- 2 Touch 

  ✓ to return to the previous station.
- 3 Touch to add the station to your favorites.
- 4 Touch to go to the next station.

### Adding an account

- Configure the account and set the type of data you wish to synchronize.When an account is set up, it will be shown in the ACCOUNTS section.

- You can touch > Sync now to have the data synchronization run in the background.

### Modifying account synchronization settings

### **Display settings**

### Setting the date and time

By default, your phone relies on the network-based date and time. You can also manually set the date and time.

### Modifying location service settings

### Setting the PIN of your SIM card

### Online update

All your personal data may be erased during a system update. It is recommended that you back up important data before updating your phone.
