Vodafone takes Germany one step closer to the gigabit age

Hanover, 19 March 2017 – Vodafone is demonstrating to the CeBIT public how it's taking us one step closer to being a gigabit society, with even faster speeds and digital innovations. It's committed to getting both cities and rural regions in Germany ready for the digital future.

Power to the air: Vodafone introduces 500 mbps of mobile connectivity in German cities

"We are facilitating the gigabit society by developing and providing the necessary super-fast networks, innovative products and future technologies. It's thanks to our gigabit networks that Germany will have the speed, flexibility and readiness to compete in future markets. Corporations, SMEs and consumers can use our data highways to take them straight into the gigabit age," said Vodafone Germany's CEO Hannes Ametsreiter. "We're setting the pace, we're setting the benchmarks and we're breaking the half a gigabit 'sound barrier'". Sometime during the next few weeks Vodafone will be starting the nationwide deployment of 500 mbps in its mobile network. Before the end of summer it will have rolled out a 500 mbps service in 15 cities, including Düsseldorf, Stuttgart and Dresden, now that 500 mbps capable smartphones are available to use the super-fast Vodafone network. All of Vodafone's customers will benefit from these impressive broadband speeds. Subscribers to the fastest prepaid product in the German market, 'CallYa', will also be getting another speed boost from Vodafone, the first carrier to introduce 375 mbps last year.

Power to the ground: half-a-megabit fibre connections for SMEs and private households

Vodafone doubled the internet rate for cable customers to 400 mbps last year. Now the 'red rocket' has shifted up a gear, leaving DSL technology even further behind, by introducing 500 mbps for SMEs and private households. Düsseldorf-based Vodafone hopes to be delivering the new speed upgrade to 20 percent of its customers by this summer, and it is nowhere near close to exhausting the potential offered by its ultra-modern fibre network. In fact, it could one day be deploying speeds as high as 20 gbps. Vodafone is already establishing the basis for this development by driving the full digitalisation of TV cable to create additional capacity for even more speed. All of Vodafone's cable connections are now digital and almost 90 percent of the some 8 million households with cable already use digital TV. It enables them to enjoy enhanced image and sound quality, plus a greater diversity of programmes.

On the home straight: Bavaria is all set to be a one gigabit state in 2019

Vodafone aims to hit the one gigabit target in 2019 – six years earlier than the Network Alliance had planned. It has chosen Bavaria to be its first gigabit state. When that happens, 70% of all Bavarian residents will have a one gigabit service available to them. Some regions will be getting the one gigabit experience earlier than Bavaria because Vodafone is running a gigabit pilot project in five cities this year.

Vodafone and the Technical University of Dresden turn Pepper into a real-time robot

Vodafone is an innovation leader driving the development of next generation 5G wireless technology. It has teamed up with the TU Dresden experts to demonstrate how the fifth generation of wireless technology will revolutionise our lives at CeBIT. 5G will enable real-time connectivity to facilitate effective human-to-machine interaction.
